The successful applicant will be a highly motivated, excellent social scientist. The person is willing and able to contribute to research on the emerging role of cities and local governments in climate policy, addressing both mitigation and adaptation. We strongly encourage to start a postdoc project. The contract will run until Dec 31st 2024, but there is an option to extend it until end of 2027.

Requirements:

- An excellent PhD in economics, political science, environmental sciences, computer science or a related subject.
- Skills in quantitative methods, in particular one or more out of: inferential statistics, modelling, machine learning, game theory.
- Proficiency in English and (preferably) satisfactory German.
- Interest in economic research on environmental problems, natural resources and sustainability.

A plus would be:

- Knowledge of and interest in one or more of the following topics: Local environmental governance, water, climate change.
- Familiarity with theories and methods in one or more of the following fields: Urban/regional economics, environmental economics, institutional analysis, digital humanities.
- Interest to combine qualitative and quantitative methods.
- Track record as a strong team player.
